

TO ALL INTERESTED PERSONS IN THE CITY OF DETROIT:

Governor Whitmer issued Executive Order 2020-75, prohibiting in-person work that is not necessary to sustain or protect life. As a result, all meetings of the Detroit Brownfield Redevelopment Authority (DBRA) will be held by electronic means until restrictions on in-person gatherings have been lifted by the Governor.

All meetings will be held consistent with Executive Order 2020-75 and will provide a means for the community to participate. Meetings will be posted in accordance with the Open Meetings Act, as modified by Executive Order 2020-75.
